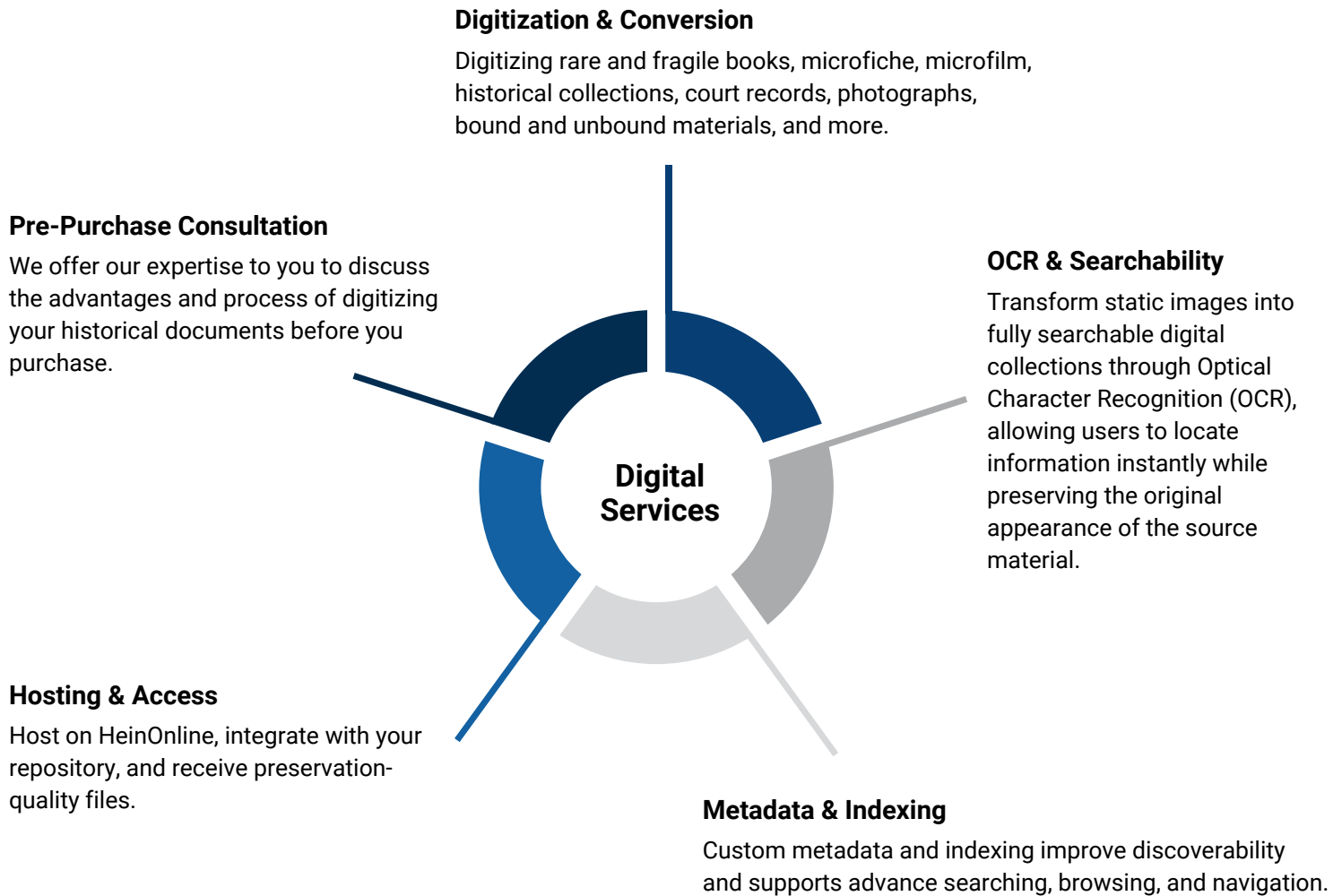

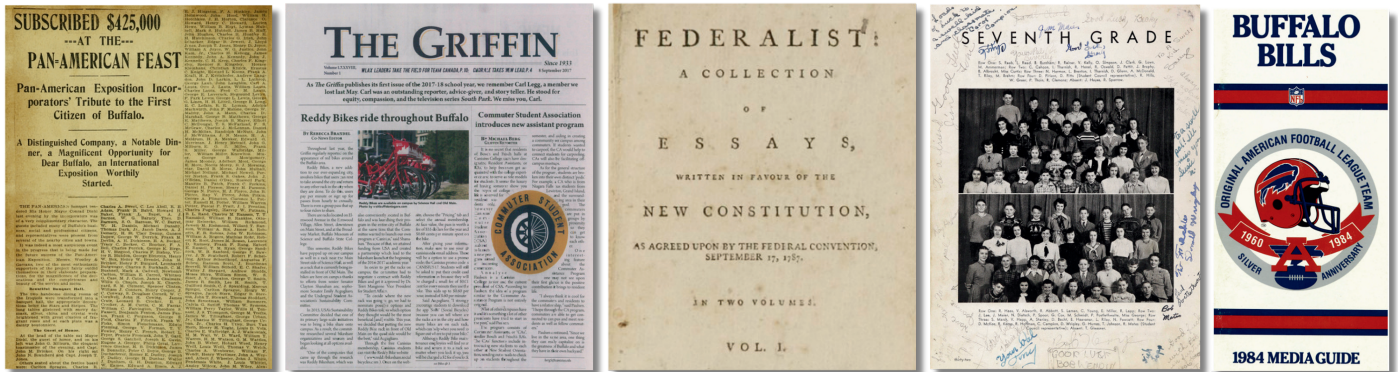
Microfilm/Microfiche Conversion
