From way back in 1991 even before the signing of the Framework Convention the Philippines has shown initiative in addressing the problem of climate change. We have also been active in the international front during the past negotiations with the rest of the international community on climate change. Early concern about the adverse impact of climate change on the country moved then President Corason Aquino to create the IACCC.'

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
